

**ORIGIN:** sport of Braeburn, Nouvelle Zélande  
- Breeder: Mr Easten  
- Licence holder: Davodeau Ligonnière

**PICKING DATE:** Braeburn (1 week after the last pick of Golden Delicious)

### FRUIT SIZE:



**BLOSSOM:** as for Granny Smith, 2 days before Golden Delicious

### POLLINATED BY:

- Granny Smith, Gala, Red delicious, Idared
- 30% Malus Golden Gem + 70% Malus INRA® Perpetu® Evereste

**POLLINATOR FOR:** Gala, Golden Delicious, Elstar, Granny Smith

**TREE TYPE:** type III (Golden Delicious), with a rather weeping growth

**GROWTH:** weak to average

### PRODUCTIVITY :

- Time till first cropping: rapid
- Productivity: very good
- Susceptibility to alternate bearing: low
- Thinning: relatively easy

### SUSCEPTIBILITY / RESISTANCE TO DISEASES:

- Average susceptibility to scab
- Susceptible to bitter pit when the crop is low

### FRUIT:

- Skin: very attractive dark red, striped blushed; nearly all the surface of the fruit is coloured
- Flesh: very firm
- Taste: sweet and sharp, typical of Braeburn

### STORAGE:

- Cold storage: March
- CA storage: June

**USES:** this sport is used by the growers who want fruit with an excellent colour in order to reduce the number of picks at harvest

### NOTES:
