FRUIT SIZE:



BLOSSOM: as for Granny Smith, 2 days before Golden Delicious

POLLINATED BY:

- Granny Smith, Gala, Red delicious, Idared
- 30% Malus Golden Gem + 70% Malus INRA® Perpetu® Evereste

POLLINATOR FOR: Gala, Golden Delicious, Elstar, Granny Smith

TREE TYPE: Type III (Golden Delicious), with a rather weeping growth

GROWTH: weak to average

PRODUCTIVITY:

- Time till first cropping: rapid
- Productivity: very good
- Susceptibility to alternate bearing: low
- Thinning: relatively easy

SUSCEPTIBILITY / RESISTANCE TO DISEASES:

- Average susceptibility to scab
- Susceptible to bitter pit when the crop is low

FRUIT:

- Skin: very attractive dark red with many stripes
- Flesh: very firm
- Taste: sweet and sharp, typical of Braeburn

STORAGE:

- Cold storage: March
- CA storage: June

USES: very interesting sport for Northern Europe where the fruit has a very good colour, important stripes resulting in an exceptional appearance
